Pearls Along the Path Meditations "Keep on Keeping On"

Matthew 17:4 (NIT) – Peter exclaimed, "Lord, it's wonderful for us to be here! If You want, I'll make three shelters as memorials – one for You, one for Moses and one for Elijah."

Each of us will find as we continue to journey through this life that there will be times of great triumphs and great trials. We all love those mountaintop times such as Peter, James and John experienced during the transfiguration of Jesus Christ (Matthew 17:1-9).
